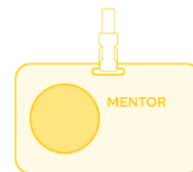
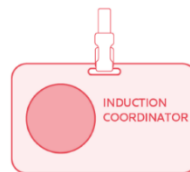
DECEMBER 2022: AUTUMN TERM UPDATE #2

This half term our focus has moved on to supporting ECTs and their mentors via twilight remote clinics. We have also continued to offer guidance to induction coordinators, especially those joining the programme for the first time.

LOOKING AHEAD – UPDATE ON LEAD PROVIDER INSPECTION PROCESS

“What to expect for ECF and NPQ full inspections”

Briefing webinar for school leaders, ECTs and NPQ participants (14/12/22)

Earlier this year, Ofsted published its new framework and handbook for inspecting lead providers of the early career framework (and national professional qualifications) starting in the spring of 2023. During these inspections, inspectors will speak to early career teachers (ECTs), mentors, induction tutors and school leaders (and NPQ participants) to inform their assessment of lead providers (ours being Ambition Institute).

We will keep you posted on this new process and on Wednesday 14th December 1.30-2.30pm, DfE/Ofsted are hosting a webinar for those interested in finding out about what these inspections will mean for various stakeholders including schools following the programme. [Register here for the webinar](#) which is open to ECTs and NPQ participants, ECF mentors, Induction tutors, school leaders such as headteachers, executive leaders, subject leaders, phase leaders, and professional development leaders. It is designed to help those working in schools understand the inspection process of lead providers and will include an opportunity to ask questions you may have.



UPDATE: FEBRUARY SATRT NPQs – APPLY NOW

Working with the [Teacher Development Trust](#) as our NPQ lead provider, Unity Teaching School Hub will be delivering the full suite of NPQs*:

- four specialist NPQs: Leading Literacy, Leading Teacher Development, Leading Behaviour and Culture, and Leading Teaching
- four leadership NPQs: Executive Leadership, Headship, Senior Leadership and Early Years Leadership

Our [website](#) signposts to details of each programme and shares guidance to help make your application as easy as possible – for ease this is summarised in two steps below:

1. **registration using this DfE portal** – it is quick to complete, should be done ASAP:
 - select ‘yes’ to knowing which lead provider you wish to work with and indicating this when prompted by selecting ‘Teacher Development Trust’ as lead provider will make sure we deliver the programme (Unity TSH, or any other TSH, is not mentioned)
 - you will need to have your TRN and National Insurance Number to hand
2. **an online application form is then sent to the applicant by our lead provider, the Teacher Development Trust - this needs to be completed ideally by 5th January so that all necessary checks can be made by 10th January deadline**

ADDITIONAL PAYMENTS AVAILABLE

Additional payments for schools with less than 600 pupils will enable them to support their teachers and leaders to undertake NPQs; this Targeted Support Fund gives a grant payment of £200/participant to settings with 1-600 pupils, for every teacher/leader they employ who participates in an NPQ.

UPDATE: UNITY TSH APPROPRIATE BODY

Our Appropriate Body (AB) service sees us working with over 240 ECTs in support of their statutory induction. Celia Moore, our AB Lead supports schools using our service and will continue to guide those registering new ECTs employed in the coming terms. The outcome of the [DfE Appropriate Body Reform and Assessment Consultation](#) has been published. Our work to date supporting transition arrangements with Suffolk LA AB sees us very well placed to meet the requirements being made. We continue to work closely with Suffolk LA AB to make the transition of AB services from LA to TSH provision.

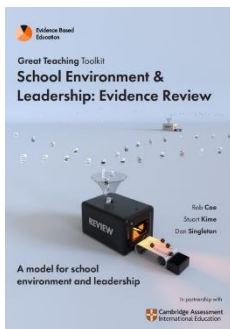

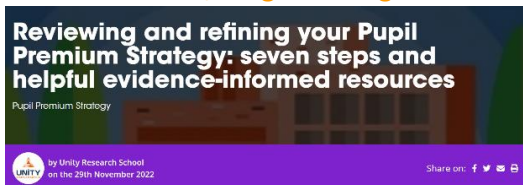
1. A great evidence-based framework for leadership learning:



School Environment and Leadership: Evidence Review

This valuable addition to the evidence base from the team at [Evidence Based Education](#) is an excellent read and provides a very useful framework for reflection and next steps. It draws on a comprehensive review of existing literature (112 studies) and identifies a set of school factors for which there is good evidence that they are related to student outcomes. These school-level factors provide what the authors describe as 'our current best bets for school leaders to pay attention to'. It is intended to have a constructive, action focus and includes recommendations to school leaders on how to use the model.
